Jeremy G Frankel and Martha A Graham walked the Beth David Section of the San Luis Cemetery in San Luis Obispo County, CA on Friday the 23rd of November. The purpose of this walk was to photograph all existing headstones and memorial markers in an effort to document those interred therein.

Additionally, this collaborative effort will produce an index that will be used to further enhance the Cemetery Records of both the Jewish Genealogical Society of San Francisco and the San Luis Obispo County Genealogical Society. In addition to the aforementioned Societies, the database information will be added to the JewishGen Online Worldwide Burial Registry. [<http://www.jewishgen.org/databases/cemetery/>]

There is a fenced section set aside for the Sinsheimer Family, the gate was open and unlocked, so that the headstones could be photographed.

The earliest burial that is marked by a headstone is that of little Dora Greenberg, who was born Aug 20 1870 and died Oct 23 1874. Her parents may be Asher and Carlotta Greenburgh [as found in the SLO 1870 Census] There is no evidence of their interment in the Beth David Section.

Several prominent Families are represented by the Memorial Markers: Goldtree, Kaiser, and Sinsheimer to name a few.
